

They have a 22-year track record of combining world-class design with community projects to produce spectacular outdoor commissions that engage diverse audiences wherever they work. You

might remember a couple of years back the huge docker puppet they made for Tilbury Cruise Terminal 70th and the silk flags for 'Women on the march' that some of you here, or out there helped make.



Founded by artistic director Ali Pretty in 1997, and inspired by her training in carnival arts in Trinidad and India, Kinetika now has an unrivalled reputation for

working with local communities on projects that change the way people feel about where they live from local community walks in Essex to

AP: What are we celebrating?

The development of Purfleet town centre has finally been approved, work is underway, and thanks to much of the hard work of the Community Forum Purfleet has been officially renamed as Purfleet—on—Thames. This is a great moment to celebrate a new era, bringing the local community of Purfleet and arts partners based at HHPP gether, to collectively create an event to welcome Thurrock residents and visitors to

Purfleet—on—Thames. and share widely what the park and the town has to offer as it develops into a joined up creative community over the next few years.

How can you get involved?

To prepare for the event Kinetika is excited to invite up to 25 local groups to take part in creating 25 hand-painted silk flags that collectively celebrate who we are as a community. Each flag will be the story of your group, and while the painting of silks may not be possible for a few months, the designing can get underway now - this is a perfect way to keep the dialogue and drawing going, whilst keeping everyone safe..



One of these flags will be designed to represent to Purfleet Community Forum and we would love to have your input.

Kinetika will send out a design brief and instructions to guide you through your flag design in May. Kinetika artists will be offering online support sessions on 12/13 May and we will ask you to submit the final design to us on June 29.

We hope that we will then be able to run silk-painting workshops for your group to come and paint your flag between end of July / early August, to confirm.

The flags will be presented at the celebration of Purfleet-On-Thames on 27 September which will also be the finale of T100 Calling; this years' T100 Festival that runs between the 12-27 of September. They will then be available for events and exhibitions in Purfleet-On-Thames over the coming years. **If you are a**

Name Change

I have asked if this could be put further north on New Tank Hill Road by the junction with the A1306. This would make it more visible to through traffic. It's about time we got noticed. VE Day 75th Anniversary

JR: At our last committee meeting it was decided to put a function together to celebrate VE day. I have applied for funding which was been granted. Due to the current situation the council have agreed to hold the funding over until things go back to normal if that is possible. TB: I also applied and received funding for Purfleet Heritage Centre's event, so a double blow.

CEDF (Community Environmental Development Fund)

JR: The same is for the CEDF fund this has also been suspended until later in the year.

Purfleet Heritage Centre Visit

TB: Earlier this month Vice Admiral Sir Tim Laurence, Princess Anne's husband made a visit to the Heritage Centre. As well as his Royal connection Sir Tim is head of English Heritage and chair of PCRL. With his military connection and involvement with our regeneration it was great to see the interest he showed.





Purfleet Regeneration

JR: Huh, Purfleet regeneration, Trevor and I had a video meeting with Andrew Pryce, Senior Development Manager for Urban Catalyst last Friday, well Trev did as my connection went down after a short time so I will let Trev fill in the gaps. The floor is yours again Trev. TB: We started to have monthly meetings with Andrew in February about progress and updates, something we have been after for a long time. The good news is there is progress.

Site investigation work by Keltbray (part of PCRL) is under way to the west of the railway in Botany Way. They are taking soil samples from the ground to test for any contamination and to understand soil properties, so foundations can be designed accordingly. Some of these bore holes are up to 25 to 30 metres deep. It is the same type of work that was carried out in Zone 1A last year or the year before. They are now in week two of a twelve week investigation. The Council have started to secure sites in this area.

Zone 1A, Hollow Woods area, the area Duncan talked about during the last meeting will be checked for nesting birds, if clear the next stage is to remove some of the trees. First they are cut down so far and then left for a few days. This allows wildlife to relocate so they can be removed. This is simplified; as









Harlow, the detached bungalow behind Hollow Cottages, Church Hollow area has been bought and will be knocked down towards the Summer-ish., to make way for a children's play area on the western side of the development. Building is due to start October onwards.

MEGA NEWS in the budget the Chancellor pledged to give £75m from the Housing Infrastructure Fund to support our development Purfleet-on-Thames. This is a great boost as it will kickstart work sooner rather than later.

TL: Sir Tim Laurence, chairman of PCRL, said: "The chancellor's pledge of £75m towards key elements of the regeneration of Purfleet-on-Thames, including a bridge over the railway, a new integrated medical centre and other social infrastructure, is a huge vote of confidence. "It demonstrates that infrastructure investment is not just about the big flagship projects like HS2, it's also about making a real difference to peoples' lives here in the Thames Estuary and in other regions of the UK. "This is a prime example of the government, Local Authority and private sector working together at all levels to unlock the huge growth potential in this fast-developing area."






New Bridge

Local Area Policing



On Thursday a Barge laden with Chalk going from Purfleet near Gravesend into the West Country, run foul on one of the Piers of the New Bridge at Westminster, which is at present built no higher then Low-Water Mark, the Piles, which were the Guard of the Piers, being broke away by the Severity of the Weather, and there being no Signal to keep Barges off; by which unhappy Accident the Barge and Loading were funk, but the Persons on board were preserved by fome Boats who put off to their Assistance.

Yellerday se'nnight an inquisition was taken at Purfleet, on the body of George Hicks, about 18 years of age, who was accidentally killed by the caving in of a chalk pit, in which he was at work.
